
President's Message from David Haight

The board has been reviewing several proposals and keeping up with the general business of the club. In July, Steve Day led an outing to Klamath Lake. We also have outings scheduled for August and September. Details of these outing are included later in this newsletter. Note the change to the August outing: Due to low returns of steelhead, the North Umpqua River is closing to fishing on July 31; therefore, we will hold a steelhead fly-fishing class at Tou Velle State Park instead.

One of the issues that the Board of Directors will need to address when meetings resume in September is determining how many board positions we will need to fill for 2024. We will likely have a few members retiring from the bord; therefore, will be looking for new people to join the board. We are also still looking for someone to take over the job of finding speakers for our monthly meetings. It is also a great way to get to know the members of the club better, and to develop a better understanding of issues affecting our sport.

Financial Report – Tim Bolling

We are required to file annual reports with the IRS, the Oregon Department of Justice, and the Oregon Department of State in order to maintain our 501(c)3 non-profit status. As we continue to grow both in membership and annual revenue, the reporting requirements increasingly become more complex and involved. In order to stay as informed as possible, we have recently joined the Nonprofit Association of Oregon, who offer a variety of ways to keep current with the requirements. Membership in the NAO is wide-spread, but includes virtually all of the Watershed Councils in Oregon.

The BBQ in June was moderately successful from a financial standpoint, with a positive cashflow of approximately \$ 2100.00 including all proceeds from the dinner itself, the raffle, and the auction. That resulted in an increase of \$ 1335.50 to our unrestricted grant fund. Unfortunately we incurred a slight loss on the cost of the dinner itself due to no-shows.

Other than our normal monthly expenses and the costs associated with the BBQ, we sponsored a float in the Ashland 4th of July parade featuring John MacDiarmid casting from a drift boat pulled by a truck driven by David Nilson. We also paid for our liability insurance which is provided through Fly Fishers International.

August Outing Changed

We were planning to host an outing to the North Umpqua River to fish for steelhead on August 12 and 13. Due to low numbers of returning summer steelhead, the North Umpqua River will be closed to all fishing from July 31 through November 30. Consequently, we will hold a steelhead fly-fishing class at the Tou Velle State Park picnic area. The class will begin at 10:00 AM. We will cover topics such as steelhead biology and life-history, where and when to fish for steelhead, what equipment to use, how to swing flies, how to dead-drift flies, fly selection, how to fight and land steelhead, and resources available to steelhead anglers. We will also work on basic Spey casting. Later in the afternoon, those that are interested can go on a tour of fishing sites on the upper Rogue River, and even do a little fishing.

Bring your steelhead fishing gear, wader, lunch, drinks, and the other items you need for a day along the river. There is an entrance fee for Tou Velle State Park, but you can get in with an Oregon State Parks Pass or a Jackson County Parks Pass. Look for the club signs once you enter the park.

LAVA LAKE OUTING

September & 10, 2023







Come join us September 9 & 10 for a fishing adventure at Lava Lake, one of the more popular Cascade Lakes. Lava Lake is about an hour from Bend and three hours from Medford. Although we will be fishing at Lava Lake, there are other great fly-fishing options, including Crane Prairie Reservoir, Twin Lakes, Hosmer Lake, and Wikiup Reservoir which are all a short drive from Lava Lake.

There is some bank access for fishing, but anglers will have better results if they fish from a watercraft. There is a full-service boat ramp for motorized craft, and fishing from pontoon boats and float tubes can be very effective as well.

Overnight accommodations include RV spaces at Lava Lake RV Resort (https:// lavalakeresort.com/), cabins and RV spaces at Twin Lakes Resort (https://twinlakesresort.net), and a forest service campground at Lava Lake (https://www.fs.usda.gov/recarea/deschutes/recarea/? recid=38894)

Because this outing will be after Labor Day weekend there should be plenty of available RV spaces and campsites.
