PROGRAM

Rogue Restoration Group

This month's presentation will be from the Rogue Restoration Group, a group of local conservation and natural resource entities, that are collaborating to build on the momentum created by removal of the mainstem dams on the Rogue River in order to continue to implement ecologically important river restoration projects and address key threats facing the resource. With funding from the Laird Norton Family Foundation, in 2011, the Geos Institute, Rogue River Keeper, the natural resource team from the Rogue Valley Council of Governments, and WaterWatch of Oregon, began working together to identify, facilitate, fund and implement ecologically significant restoration work in the Rogue Basin. The combined group has years of scientific and technical experience in fish biology, climate change, water quality, monitoring, water resources, dam removals, restoration work, grass roots organizing, grant writing, and contract and project management. This year the Southern Oregon Land Conservancy has joined the group adding expertise in conservation easements and land acquisitions. Speakers Brian Barr (Geos Institute), Forrest English (Rogue Riverkeeper), Craig Tuss (Rogue Valley Council of Governments), Craig Harper Southern region Land Conservancy) and Bob Hunter (WaterWatch), will discuss the exciting projects and work of the group. Much of the Rogue Restoration Group's work has been supported by generous financial and volunteer contributions from the Rogue Flyfishers.


